The Challenge of Cross-Cultural Leadership

Leadership is culturally-bound: what works well at home may not export easily. American leadership may not work well in the UK, France or Germany and vice versa, for instance.

Concepts of leadership are also changing at macro level, with a global shift away from the ideal of the leader as a charismatic individualistic hero, to a more listening and coaching style.

As East and West interact increasingly with each other, it is vital for leaders of whatever nationality or region to engage in debate on their own national (and personal) style, reflect on how it works in a global context and learn how to bridge cultures for better results.

The CCLME Course

- One and a half days on the impact of culture on leadership – what culture is; values and communication; the uses and dangers of generalisation; the Lewis Model of linearactive, multi-active and reactive cultures and where the Middle Eastern world and the participants fit in (based on a pre-course online survey); key commonalities and differences between Middle Eastern and Western Cultures; persuasion, leadership styles, collaboration and trust; positioning and boosting the impact of Middle Eastern leaders on the global stage.

Who is this Course for?

This course is for Middle Eastern leaders, or future leaders, from either public or private sectors. It is particularly relevant for leaders who need to lead other nationalities, as well as leaders who are led by other nationalities.
